What is this Product?

Product Type:

The AQA Small Cap Fund (the "Sub-Fund") aims to achieve capital growth and income.

Maturity:

The Duration of the Sub-Fund is indefinite.

Investment Policy:

The Investment Manager ("We") shall invest in a portfolio of equity and equity-related securities (namely, common and preferred stock, convertible securities, warrants and rights) of European and US small-cap companies. The securities will primarily be quoted or traded on Regulated Markets in Europe and US. The Sub-Fund may be invested 100% in small-cap equities. Small-cap companies are those which have a market capitalisation less than €2 billion. The Sub-Fund will have no sector bias.

The Investment Manager employs a philosophy of "relative value" investing for the security selection process - i.e., the Investment Manager will seek to invest in securities that represent comparatively good value when assessed against other stocks within the same investment universe.

Contingent on market conditions, the Sub-Fund may also be invested 100% in fixed-income securities issued both by corporate or sovereign issuers. The fixed-income assets shall generally be, but shall not be limited to, listed or unlisted, rated or unrated hybrid bonds with no particular duration or market capitalisation. Up to 100% of the Sub-Fund's assets may be invested globally in fixed income assets issued by a range of issuers. We will aim to maintain an average credit quality of BB.

The Sub-Fund may in addition also invest in other interest-bearing securities such as, but not limited to, contingent convertible bonds, perpetual bonds and warrant-linked bonds. The Sub-Fund may be biased towards the financial sector when investing in such instruments.

While the Sub-Fund will have a long bias, exchange traded futures, OTC Contract for Differences (CFDs) or Credit Default Swaps (CDSs) exposures may be utilised by the Sub-Fund to gain synthetic short exposures either as a hedge against a long position or for investment purposes. The Sub-Fund's net short credit exposure is not expected to exceed 20% of the Fund's Net Asset Value.

Furthermore, the Sub-Fund may directly or indirectly invest in credit related securities such as asset back securities, subordinated debt and credit default swaps.

For defensive or temporary purposes, the Sub-Fund may hold cash and cash equivalents and invest in short-term fixed income instruments, money market funds. These securities may be held at any time for cash management purposes, pending investment in accordance with its Investment Policy and to meet operating expenses and redemption requests. The Sub-Fund is being actively managed.

What happens if AQA Capital Limited is unable to pay out?
