What is this Product?

Product Type:

Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) Fund.

Investment Objective:

Maturity:

The Sub-Fund is generally suitable for investors willing to hold their investment for a minimum period of five years.

Investment Policy:

The Investment Manager ("We") may invest directly or indirectly in a global portfolio of corporate and/or government bonds (including contingent convertible bonds) and/or equity securities of large-to-mid cap companies. Bonds and equities may be listed or unlisted. The The AOA Global Dynamic Strategies Fund (the "Sub-Fund") aims to achieve an increase in Fund may achieve such indirect exposures through investment in UCITS compliant collective investment schemes and Exchange Traded Funds, however, will not invest in funds managed by the Investment Manager. The Fund will not be biased to a particular geographical, sector or industry. Investments made can be in investment grade, sub-investment grade and unrated securities with no duration bias. The Sub-Fund is being actively managed.

The allocation to single name bonds shall not exceed 70%, while that of single name equities shall not exceed 40%. Such limits will not apply to indirect exposures to bonds and equities. Large-cap companies shall be taken as those having a market capitalisation of over ten (10) This Class is an accumulator class so the income from investments held for the Class will not billion, whilst mid-cap shall be taken as those have a market capitalisation of between two (2) to ten (10) billion.

> For investment, temporary or defensive purposes we may hold short-term fixed income instruments, money market instruments, money market funds and cash and cash equivalents. The Sub-Fund may also hold such securities for cash management purposes.

> The Sub-Fund may also invest in exchange traded and OTC derivatives, including but not limited to currency forwards and CFDs. OTC derivatives will be entered into with Approved Counterparties.

> Derivative underlying will consist of any eligible underlying in terms of the UCITS Directive. The Sub-Fund may also be exposed indirectly to commodities such as but not limited to precious metals, via UCITS eligible ETFs or ETPs.

What happens if AQA Capital Limited is unable to pay out?
